END OF YEAR REPORTS

End of Year Reports will be going home with all Kinder to Grade Six students next Wednesday 12 December. The End of Year reports summarise your child's overall end-of-year results. Your child will receive an assessment based on the descriptions below for English, Mathematics, History and Science. It reflects their progress and achievement against the Australian Curriculum Achievement Standards.

End of Year Reports for Kindergarten students will go home Wednesday 12 and Thursday 13 (depending on your child's days) and are written against the Early Years Learning Framework Outcomes.

Below is a guide to assist you with your understanding of your P-6 child's assessment.

A guide to Understanding your Child's Assessment		
A - Well above the standard expected	The student has an extensive knowledge and understanding of the content and can readily apply this knowledge. In addition, the student has achieved a very high level of competence in the processes and skills and can apply these skills to new situations.	
B - Above the standard expected	The student has a thorough knowledge and understanding of the content and a high level of competence in the processes and skills. In addition, the student is able to apply this knowledge and these skills to most situations.	
C - At the standard expected	The student has a sound knowledge and understanding of the main areas of content and has achieved the expected level of competence in the processes and skills.	
D - Approaching the standard expected	The student has a basic knowledge and understanding of content and has achieved a basic level of competence in the processes and skills.	
E - Below the standard expected	The student has elementary knowledge and understanding in a few areas of the content and has achieved very limited competence in some of the processes and skills.

STUDENTS WITH MEDICAL CONDITIONS
